Affidavit of Personal Service (Form F15)

This form is used to prove in court that court documents have been personally delivered, by someone other than the parties involved, to the person they're intended for (according to the rules of court). It needs to be filled out by the person who delivered the documents. See <u>Serve Supreme Court documents by personal service.</u>

If you fill this out on-screen, use the **Tab** key to jump from grey field to grey field. This will ensure dates are formatted correctly. If you print a blank form and require more space:

- Open the Word form to add more space on-screen. Put the cursor in a grey box and press enter/return to create a new blank line, and print the form again.
- Or write "See attached" on the form and attach a page with the additional text.
